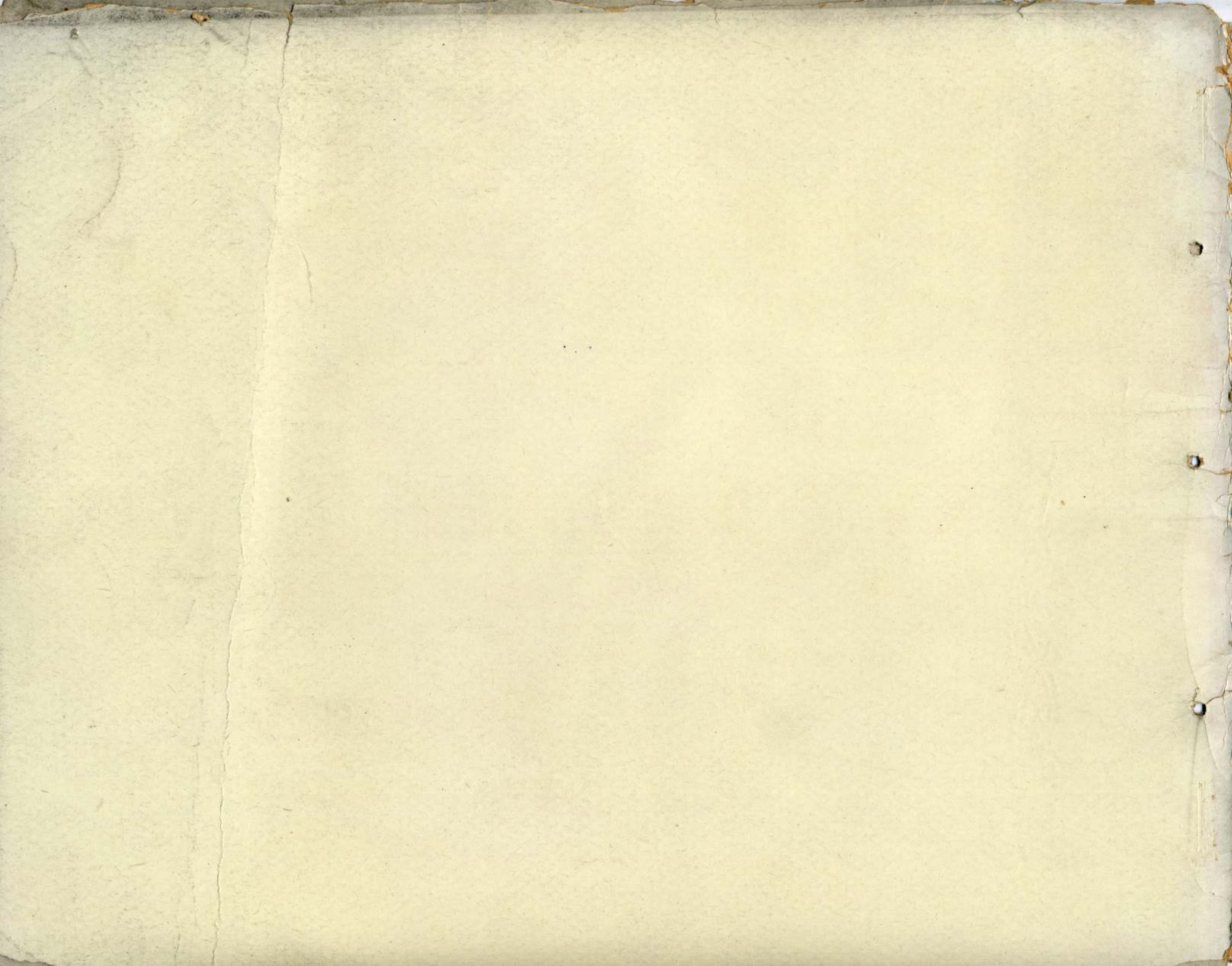

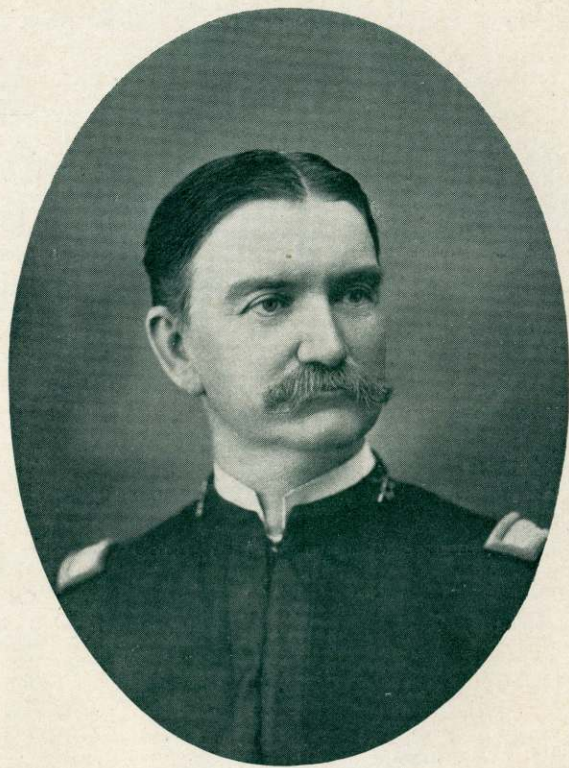

Company "A," First Infantry, West Virginia National Guard.

WHEN the West Virginia National Guard was being re-organized in the fall of 1899, a movement toward authorizing a company for Wheeling was started. Three unsuccessful efforts to organize a company in this city had been made during the past eight years, but never could more than twenty-two men be secured. Owing to the apathy heretofore manifested, the State authorities were in doubt as to again authorizing an organization here. Events, however, have proved that that feeling, very wisely, was overcome.

On January 3, 1900, Colonel Clarence L. Smith, then on the supernumerary list as Colonel of the First Regiment Infantry, West Virginia National Guard, was restored to active command of that regiment, by reason of Colonel Macker Babb having resigned the colonelcy to accept a commission as second lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps.

The efforts that had been made for the authorization of a military company in Wheeling, while Colonel Babb was in command, had placed matters in such shape that one of Colonel Smith's first official acts was the nomination of Mr. John F. Glass for Captain and Lieutenant C. E. Morris for first lieutenant. These nominations were made on January 6th, and the officers and prospective members immediately began the work of enrolling names. The number of enlisted men allowed was forty-five, and this number was promptly secured. On January 30th, first lieutenant George E. Gramm, Quartermaster of the first Infantry, came to Wheeling and "mustered in" the company, which had been designated by Brigadier General George W. Curtin, Brigade Commander of the West Virginia National Guard, as Company "A," First Regiment Infantry, West Virginia National Guard.

The first meeting of Company "A" was held at its armory, No. 1314 Market street, on the evening of the first of February. Weekly drills were ordered, but to have the company well enough drilled to participate in the grand parade scheduled for "Dewey Day," February 22nd, it was deemed necessary to order three drills a week. The boys manifested considerable interest in drilling, although it was necessary in some cases to send out "details" to bring in recalcitrant members.

The company assembled on February 6th for the purpose of electing a second lieutenant. After several ballots, involving a spirited contest, Private Wm. T. Crawford secured a majority of the votes, and was accordingly declared elected. His commission as Second Lieutenant was issued in a few days. Private Charles G.

Dobbins had been a leading candidate for this honor, but on account of sickness, was unable to be present on the night of election.

Acting non-commissioned officers were appointed by Captain Glass on February 16, as follows: First Sergeant, Guy S. Weistling, Quartermaster Sergeant, Lee F. Dobbs; Sergeants, Charles G. Dobbins, George W. Steenrod, Thomas Harvey Pollock, John J. Fitzpatrick; Corporals, Harry B. McGrane, Charles W. Alexander, Ollie Kline, Henry J. Stollar; Trumpeters, Clarence Echols and Leroy M. Reed. These non-commissioned officers were subsequently recommended for appointment. The appointments were made by Colonel Smith, to date February 21st.

On the night of February 21st there arrived in Wheeling, Admiral George Dewey, hero of the battle of Manila Bay and Admiral of the United States Navy, and Lieutenant John M. Doddridge, of the United States Navy, a former Wheeling boy. Company "A" participated in the escort of these distinguished naval officers, and it was its first appearance in public.

In the demonstration on the day following, which was the greatest public event in the history of Wheeling, Company "A" acquitted itself with credit. After the short period of three weeks, during which seven drills were had, the company marched like veterans through the slushy and overcrowded streets. There was a steady downpour of rain all day. As great a compliment as could have been paid the boys was a remark overheard while marching down Market street. One man asked another "Who are these boys?" His answer was, "Why, can't you tell by the way they march that they are the Tenth Pennsylvania." The crowd gave three cheers for the Tenth Pennsylvania. The Pennsylvania boys were in the rear, and had returned from the Philippine Islands only a few months before.

The Linsly Cadets were acting as escort to the Admiral, but on account of the immense crowds it was found necessary to call upon Company "A" to take the post of honor. It was a difficult task to keep the way clear for the carriages, and it was found necessary to use force in many cases. Several over-jubilant spectators were gently punched with bayonets, but aside from torn overcoats no damage was done.

"Dewey Day" being over, drills once a week were ordered. Monday night is the regular drill night.

The next public appearance of the company was on Decoration Day, May 30th, 1900, when, on invitation from the J. W. Holliday Post No. 17, G. A. R., it participated in the ceremonies of that oc-

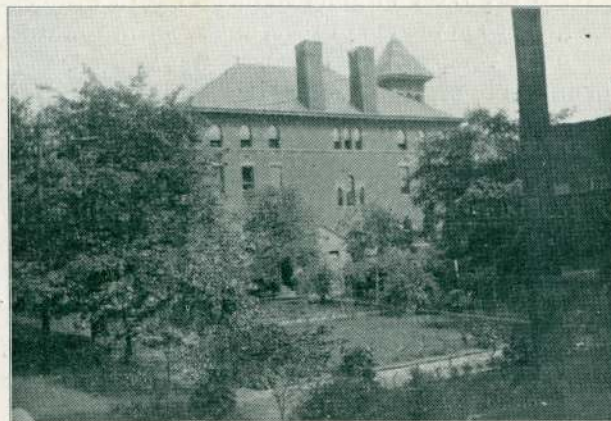

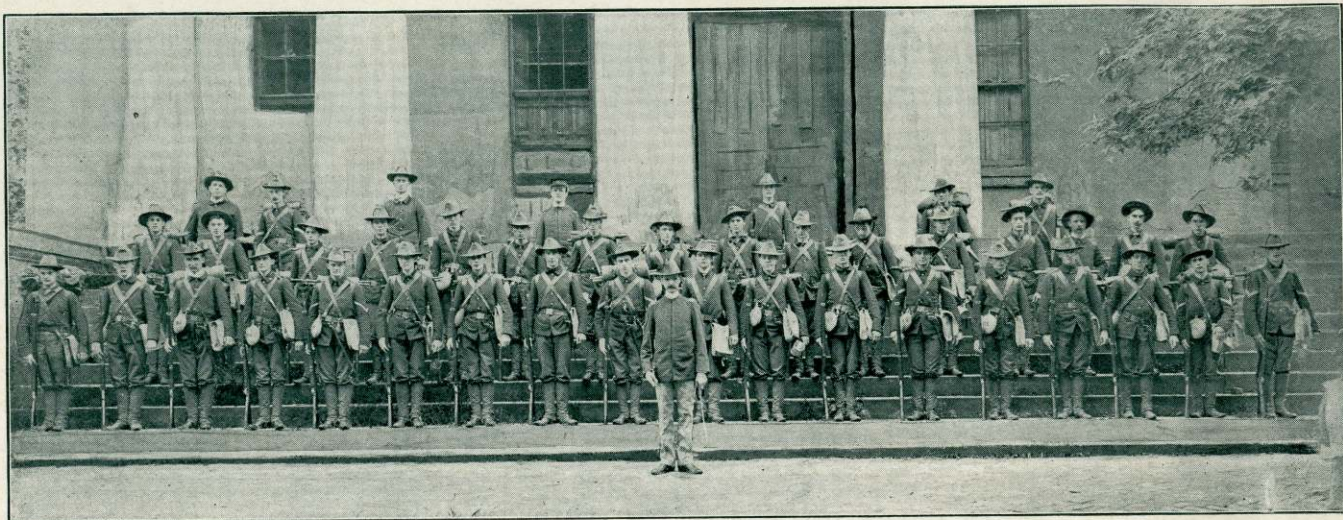

casian. The march was from the old court house to Peninsula Cemetery. Here the old soldiers were addressed by the commander-in-chief, Governor G. W. Atkinson. Upon the conclusion of the speaking, a salute of honor was fired over the grave of a deceased veteran, the entire company participating in the firing. "Taps" were sounded by Trumpeters Echols and Reed.

The next public appearance was on the morning of Monday, August 20th, when the company marched from the armory to the Baltimore & Ohio railroad station on their way to camp, at Keyser, Mineral county, West Virginia. Prior to the "Dewey Day" celebration, it had been many years since the people of Wheeling had seen a uniformed body of soldiers, and naturally many were curious to get a look at them. The only time in recent years that a body of soldiers had been seen on our streets was on the occasion of the return of Captain A. A. Franzheim with his command, Company "G," Fourth United States Volunteer Infantry, "the Immunes."

Company "A" left the Baltimore & Ohio station at 11 o'clock on that morning and arrived at "Camp Spilman," at Keyser, at about 7 o'clock in the evening. The work of pitching tents was immediately begun, but owing to darkness and the extreme rocky condition of the ground, the work was very difficult, and it was nearly 10 o'clock when it was finished. However, the next morning the camp was re-arranged and tents properly "pitched." With actual military life, real discipline began. While the discipline was not altogether strict, it was more so than some of our citizen soldiers, who were ignorant of camp life, had expected, and as a consequence, some of them reposed in the guard house for a few hours. One, however, was compelled to spend a good portion of two days there.

Company "A," although one of the youngest in the regiment, stood well at the head in drills and inspection, it excelling many of the older companies in everything.

Many amusing incidents occurred at camp, most of them being after "taps" had sounded. Many "run" the guard lines, and others perpetrated jokes on their comrades.

The regiment broke camp Monday morning, August 27th, at 9 o'clock. At 7 o'clock Paymaster General Boggs paid off the entire regiment, a pleasing ceremony to the boys. The company arrived home at 5 o'clock in the evening. It is safe to say that no member regrets having attended the encampment. Most of them were sorry it ended so soon.

The roster of Company "A" contains many who served in the volunteer army during the war with Spain. Lieutenant Morris served as First Lieutenant in Company "D," Second West Virginia Volunteers; Lieutenant Crawford as a private in Company

"M," First West Virginia Volunteers; Sergeant Dobbins and Fitzpatrick, Corporal McGrane, Trumpeters Echols and Reed, Privates Angus, Clovis, Winam and Savage served in the First and Second West Virginia Volunteers. Private Gordon served with the 161st Indiana Volunteers.

The roster of the First Regiment Infantry, W. V. N. G., is as follows: Colonel, Clarence L. Smith; Lieut. Col., R. B. Ash; Adjutant, 1st Lieut. John Henshaw; Surgeon, Major G. M. Joseph; Quartermaster, 1st Lieut. Z. T. Stewart; Commissary, 1st. Lieut. S. W. Poe.

The battalions are arranged as follows:

First Battalion—Major W. W. Scott, Adjutant, 1st Lieut. Ephraim F. Morgan; Co. "A," Wheeling; Co. "C," Wellsburg; Co. "D," Anthem.

Second Battalion—Major H. R. Smith; Adjutant, Capt. Earl Vance; Co. "G," Rowlesburg; Co. "K," Clarksburg; Co. "L," Morgantown.

Third Battalion—Major A. J. Moore; Adjutant, 1st Lieut. G. W. Weaver; Co. "E," Martinsburg; Co. "H," Piedmont; Co. "M," Terra Alta.

Private Charles V. Winam was appointed company cook, and the healthful appearance of the members on return from camp well attested the fact that the cooking was all that could have been asked for. Cook Winam was assisted by Private George McGuinness.

Several members of the Company have enlisted in the regular army and U. S. Marine Corps. Several, also, have been summarily discharged upon the recommendation of Captain Glass, for the good of the service. The organization is now free from all undesirable material, and no man will be enlisted whose presence would be a detriment to it.

Trumpeter Reed enlisted in the U. S. Marine Corps, and Trumpeter Echols was appointed chief trumpeter of the regiment.

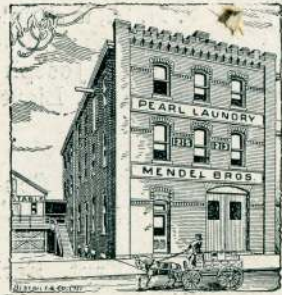
The discipline at home is far from being strict. The attendance at drills averages about fifty per cent. Members are granted excuses from attending drills from time to time, but any member who expects to run matters of that kind usually brings himself before the summary court.

The two regiments of the W. V. N. G. are now composed of nine companies each, of forty-five to fifty men each. It has been decided to increase them to twelve companies of seventy-five men each. This increase will allow Company "A" an increase of thirty men. The total strength of each regiment will be 900 enlisted men.

It is likely that next year's encampment will be by Brigade, and for ten days, in which event there will be considerable hustling on the part of different cities throughout the state for preference. The brigade will be composed of about 1,900 officers and men.

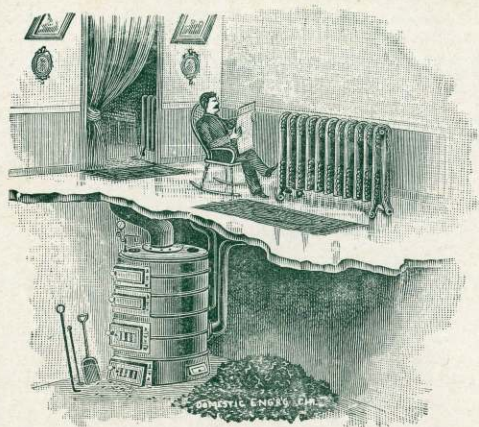
