○ AN ACT ○

Incorporating the Green Hill Cemetery Company, of Berkeley County, Va.—Passed March 4th, 1854.

WHEREAS, Bernard Doll, Philip Dieffenderfer, George Seibert, William N. Riddle, John E. Norris, J. O. Addison, Edmund P. Hunter, John Weller, Alexander Newcomer, Wm. H. Mong, Godleib Noll, E. Showers, D. H. Doll, Jacob Seibert and John P. Kearfoot, citizens of Berkeley county, have associated for the purpose of establishing a public Cemetery, and for that purpose design purchasing a tract of land, not to exceed twenty acres, lying near the town of Martinsburg; and whereas said citizens have prayed for an act of incorporation, representing that the land about to be purchased by them, is so situated that it is not now, and will not at any future time, be included in any part of said town, or be required for streets thereof, or for roads, lanes or alleys, or for any other public use; and whereas they further represent that they have agreed among themselves, to derive no pecuniary profit or benefit whatever from said purchase, but to purchase their own burial lots at the same rate at which they sell to others, and hold the fund arising from the sales, after refunding the original cost of the land, for the improvement and repair of the Cemetery, and the object of the petitioners being deemed worthy of encouragement—

1. *Be it therefore enacted, by the General Assembly, that the persons named in the preamble to this Act, be, and they are hereby made and constituted a body politic, and corporate, under the name and style of "THE GREEN HILL CEMETERY COMPANY," with full power in that name, to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, to have a common seal, to make by-laws and regulations for the government of the Company, to hold property, make contracts, and have such powers and capacity as are usual in such cases; provided, that the real estate, held by said Company, shall be held and used for no other purpose, than a Cemetery, and shall not exceed in quantity twenty acres; and provided, further, that the money and personal property acquired, owned and possessed by said Company, shall not exceed five thousand dollars.*

2. *That the Officers of said Company shall be a President, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be annually elected by the Company, and whose duties shall be, from time to time, prescribed by the by-laws, rules and regulations of the Company.*

3. *That no streets, lanes, roads or alleys shall at any time be established or made, over the said land, or any part thereof, without the*

consent of the Company; nor shall the same be condemned or taken for any public use.

4. That said Company shall, from time to time, elect from the lot-holders, persons to fill the vacancies in the corporate body, which may, from time to time occur, by death or removal from the county; provided, however, that it shall require at least two-thirds of the remaining Corporation to make such election.

5. That no interest of a Corporator or lot-holder in the property of said Company, shall be subjected in any way to the payment of debts, pass by insolvency to assignees, or into the hands of executors or administrators, but the rights and interests shall remain in the families of such according to the course of descents.

6. That the police regulations of the town of Martinsburg, shall extend to and be in force over said land and all its appurtenances.

7. This Act shall be in force from the passing thereof.



PREAMBLE.

WHEREAS, Bernard Doll, Philip Dieffenderfer, George Seibert, Wm. N. Riddle, Jno. E. Norris, J. O. Addison, E. P. Hunter, John Weller, Alexander Newcomer, Wm. H. Mong, Godleib Noll, Ezekiel Showers, Daniel H. Doll, Jacob Seibert and John P. Kearfott, citizens of Berkeley county, have been by an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, (passed March 4th, 1854,) made and constituted a body politic and corporate, under the name and style of THE GREEN HILL CEMETERY COMPANY—and in accordance with said Act, have purchased of Ezekiel Showers a certain lot of land east of the town of Martinsburg, containing fifteen and one-fourth acres, for a Public Cemetery, and in order that they may properly fulfil the intention of said Act, they do make and ordain the following as their Constitution, By Laws, Rules and Regulations.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

The association shall be known by the name of THE GREEN HILL CEMETERY COMPANY, and shall consist of a President, Secretary, Treasurer and Board of Managers, who shall have the supervision and control of its affairs.

ARTICLE II.

The Corporation shall annually, on the last Saturday in April, elect by ballot from their number a President, Secretary and Treasurer. They shall fill such vacancies in any of the above offices as may happen, caused by death, resignation or removal from the county—from the other Corporators, but in all cases of elections for said officers, a majority of the whole body shall be necessary for a choice.

ARTICLE III.

The Board of Managers shall consist of the Incorporators and their successors in office, any five of whom shall constitute a quorum to transact business. They shall hold stated meetings in every month, and special meetings whenever it may be deemed necessary, and from time to time make public such rules and regulations as may be deemed expedient.

ARTICLE IV.

All Officers and Agents, not hereinbefore provided for, shall be elected at a stated meeting of the Board.

Adopted May, 1859.

BY-LAWS.

The President

Shall preside at all meetings of the Board, and shall preserve order therein.

In the absence of the President, his place shall be filled by an appointment pro tempore.

He may on his own authority, and shall on the written request of three Managers, direct the Secretary to call a special meeting of the Board.

He shall sign all orders drawn on the Treasurer for payments authorized to be made by the Board, which orders shall be countersigned by the Secretary, as hereinafter provided.

The Secretary.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary to attend all the meetings of the Board, or if prevented by indisposition, or otherwise, he shall send the necessary books and papers to the place of meeting, and shall keep fair minutes of their proceedings.

He shall countersign all orders on the Treasurer which may have been signed by the President and directed by the Board.

He shall notify the members of the Board of all special meetings, naming time and place.

He shall, in a book provided for the purpose, keep a true record of all the lot holders, and shall duly note therein all transfers that shall be made, and furnish the Superintendent, from time to time, with a correct list thereof.

He shall also do and perform all the duties which may be enjoined on him by the Board incident to his office of Secretary; and at the expiration of the time of his appointment, shall deliver up un mutilated, to his successor, or to such person as shall be duly authorized to receive the same, all books and papers belonging to the Company, and which shall have been kept by him or come into his possession in the discharge of his duties as Secretary.

The Treasurer.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to pay all orders drawn on him, as hereinbefore provided, and report in writing the state of the funds at every stated meeting of the Board, designating in detail the amount received and expended during the month, and the balance on hand.

He shall issue all orders for interments, but no such order for interment shall be issued by him unless all arrearages due upon the lots for which such order shall have been demanded, or due by the owner thereof, shall have been fully paid and discharged.

He shall also collect and receive all other monies and dues, belonging to the Company, subject to the order of the Board, and shall perform such other duties as may be required of him appertaining to the office of Treasurer, and at the expiration of the term of his appointment, shall deliver up to his successor in office, or to such other person as shall be duly authorized to receive the same, all money, property and effects, books, documents and papers in his possession belonging to the Company, or which shall have been kept by him, or come into his possession in discharge of his duties as Treasurer.

The Common Seal of the Company shall be placed in his keeping, and he shall be authorized to issue deeds under the Common Seal, and execute all other instruments of writing requiring the corporation seal, which may be directed by the Board, in accordance with the act of incorporation and its laws.

He shall, within one month after his election and before entering upon the duties of his office, qualify for the true and faithful performance of the several liabilities therein above specified, by giving bond, with approved security, in the sum of five hundred dollars, for the faithful performance of his duties as Treasurer.

The Superintendent.

It shall be the duty of the Board to elect a Superintendent, whose term of office shall be for one year, or until a successor be duly elected—Provided, however, that he may be removed at any time for misconduct, or not complying with the regulations of the Board, a majority of the whole number agreeing thereto.

He shall have the general direction and control under the

Board of Managers, of the improvement of the premises. He shall see that the regulations of the Board of Managers, with respect to the improvement on lots by the holders thereof, be properly observed,

He shall have charge, and keep an account of the property, tools and implements of the Company, which may be on the premises.

He shall keep a record, which shall contain an account of all the interments that take place in the Cemetery, in the form determined by the Board. No interment shall take place in the Cemetery without the permit of the Treasurer.

This permit shall be handed to the Superintendent, but who will not be responsible for its preparation by the time appointed, unless he shall have eight hours of daylight previous notice thereof. He shall report to the Board of Managers, at least once every month, the number of interments that have taken place.

He shall keep clear all the walks, lots and avenues, and shall see that the rules and regulations adopted by the Board of Managers from time to time are enforced, and expel all persons for improper conduct at the Cemetery, nor shall he permit any intoxicating drink to be used on the premises.

He shall at the expiration of his term of office, deliver up to his successor, or to such person as shall be duly authorized to receive the same, all the books, papers and property which shall have been kept by him, or come into his possession, in the discharge of his duty as Superintendent.

Lot holders who may wish either to enclose their lots, construct vaults, or have their boundaries more fully defined, must first apply to the Superintendent, whose directions they will conform to on these as well as in the erection of other improvements, attending funerals, &c., as it is to him the Managers look for the enforcement of these rules, by visitors generally, and for the maintenance of decorum in the Cemetery on all occasions — and as it is desired that lot holders shall have every facility afforded them, in the care of their lots, it is enjoined on the Superintendent, in his intercourse with them, to consult their wishes in this respect as far as he can do so, consistent with his other duties.

Committees.

At the first meeting of the Board after its annual organization, the President shall appoint the following Standing Committees, to consist of three members each, viz: a Committee on Grounds and Improvements, and a Committee on Accounts and Finance.

The President of the Board, for the time being, shall be ex-officio a member of these Committees.

Committee on Grounds and Improvements.

It shall be the duty of this Committee to recommend to the consideration of the Board such plans as they may deem essential for the preservation or improvement of the grounds or property of the Company, and to carry into effect all decisions of the Board as regards the same, unless otherwise ordered—they shall see that the grounds, fences, buildings, trees and shrubbery, and other property, be kept in cleanly and good condition, and report to the Board any misconduct on the part of the Superintendent, or workmen who may be in the employ of the Company and not coming under the immediate notice of any other Committee.

This Committee shall examine the plans of all new alterations in the arrangements of the Cemetery, and of all embellishments hereafter proposed—they shall devise and recommend to the Board such plans as they may deem best for beautifying the grounds and buildings belonging to the Company.

Committee on Accounts and Finance.

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Accounts and Finance to examine and report, at each stated meeting, on all bills contracted by the Board, or any of its Committees duly authorized so to contract, before the same shall be presented to the Board for its approval, and to devise ways and means to defray expenses; and also to invest, under the direction of the Board, such surplus funds as may from time to time be in the treasury—they shall also semi-annually examine and audit the Treasurer's accounts, and report to the Board the amounts received and disbursed by him, the amount of cash and other securities in his hands belonging to the Company, together with the amount and character (if any) of the investment made.

Admittance.

Persons on foot will be admitted on all days of the week (except Sundays) from 9 o'clock, A. M., until sunset.

Sundays.

Admittance can only be granted, on this day of the week, to funerals and the relatives and friends accompanying them, or to lot holders, with members of their family or friends in company.

Visitors in General.

Visitors shall keep on the walks, and shall not pluck flowers or shrubs or injure the trees. Children are not admitted unless accompanied by their parents, guardians or care takers, who in all cases will be held responsible for their good conduct.

Enclosure of Lots.

The Managers require that all stones, iron, brick, mortar and other material employed in the enclosure of lots, &c., shall be introduced into these grounds either on broad-wheeled carts or truck wagons, or by hand, to be first laid on the side of the road most convenient to the lot or lots to be enclosed, and from thence to the place required either on wheel-barrow or by hand, and all surplus material must be removed by the lot-holder using them. Boards must be furnished to lay on the ground, to prevent injury to the grass or walks.

Any wall erected on lots must be within the lines, and cannot exceed three feet in height above the surrounding grounds. No trees growing in the lots to be removed therefrom without the consent of the Board of Managers.

The graves dug therein must be at least six inches within the entire line thereof, and not less than five feet deep.

The earth in enclosed lots cannot be elevated above the surrounding grounds without the consent of the Managers.

Vaults.

In building vaults, the same rule must be observed in conveying material to the place required as is pointed out for the enclosures. The walls of vaults must be confined within the limits of the lots on which they are built.

Lots not Transferable.

The Managers inform persons who may wish to obtain lots in this Cemetery, that they will have the grounds they purchase secured to them and their families forever, and for the burial of such other white persons as they may choose to admit—provided such admission is free of charge and without any compensation, but owners cannot re sell or transfer their lots to any other person whatever, without the consent of the Board of Managers, first had and obtained in writing. No improvements can be commenced on any lot, or interment made therein, prior to a receipt obtained therefor from the Treasurer.

Monuments.

The Board of Managers have no wish to interfere with individual taste in the construction of monuments, &c., but to protect the interest of each separate purchaser, they reserve to themselves explicitly the right to prevent the erection of large improvements, which might interfere with the rights of others, the general effect, or obstruct any principal view.

Single Interments.

A suitable place has been appropriated for single interments, either for strangers or for others.

Interments.

All applications for interment must be made to the Treasurer, and no interment shall take place without a permit, signed by the Treasurer. All elevated graves shall be kept sodded, and not permitted to exceed eighteen inches in height.

Rates of Charges.

The price of a lot shall be as follows:

The Regular Lots, 16 by 20 feet,	\$25 00
For Irregular Lots, 8 cents per square foot, not to exceed	25 00

The charge for a single grave shall be

For a resident of the county	3.00
For a stranger - - - - -	5.00

The charges for digging graves shall be as follows:

For persons over 12 years of age - - - - -	\$3.00
For persons under 12 years of age - - - - -	2.00
For dis-interring bodies - - - - -	2.00
For re-interring in the Cemetery - - - - -	2.00

The above charges to apply to plain graves--where any

extra work or any change of plan is required, the work to be done under the direction of the Committee on Grounds, &c., who will fix a reasonable price for the same.

Alteration of Rules.

Any proposal to alter or amend the foregoing rules for the government of the Cemetery, shall be made at one stated meeting of the Company and acted on at the next (when the whole number of the corporators shall be notified to attend.)—provided, that such alterations or amendments may be made at any time, if at least eight members shall agree thereto.

AN ORDINANCE

IN RELATION TO GRAVEYARDS AND CEMETERIES.

SEC. 1. Prohibiting the entering of Grave- | SEC. 2. Duty of the Grave-digger or Sexton.
yards or Cemeteries.

SEC. 1. *Be it ordained by the Council of the Corporation of Martinsburg,* That if any person shall enter either of the graveyards or cemeteries by climbing over the enclosure or otherwise than through the gates made for the purpose, or if any person shall break, mark, scratch, write upon, or otherwise deface or injure any tomb or grave stone, monument, vault or other memorial within the same, or cut, injure or destroy any tree, shrub, or flower placed therein for ornament or otherwise, cut or mar any grass, he or she so offending shall forfeit and pay to the town for the use of such graveyard or cemetery a fine of not less than one nor more than twenty dollars.

SEC. 2. It is hereby made the special duty of the grave-digger or the sexton of the graveyards and warden of the cemetery to keep the gates aforesaid secured or fastened with good locks, and to report every violation of the first section of this Ordinance, of which he may have any knowledge himself or from the information of others, to the Mayor or any Justice of the County of Berkeley, with the name of the offender, in order that he, she or they may be prosecuted therefor under this Ordinance.

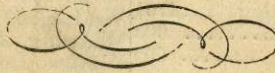

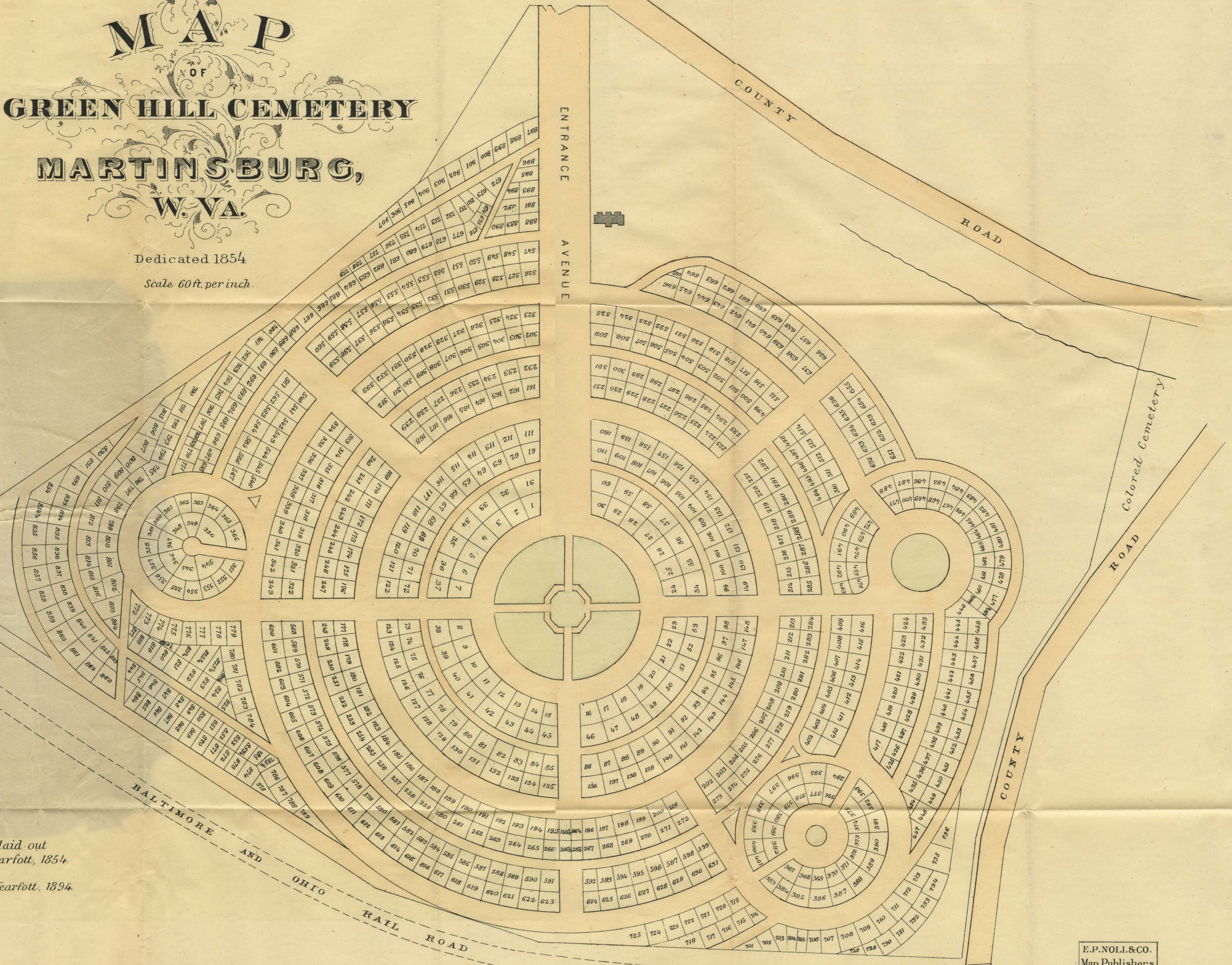
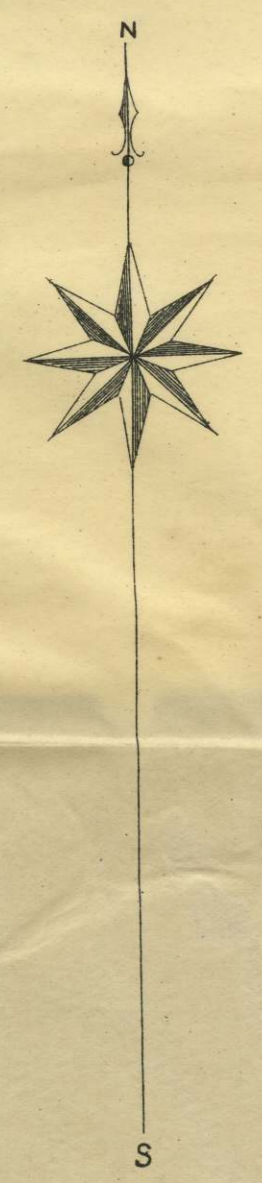
